EXODUS JOURNEY TO THE PROMISED LAND FEBRUARY 24 - MARCH 10, 2026







- Day 1 Tuesday, 24 February: Departure from USA, overnight flight including dinner, breakfast and in-flight entertainment.
- Day 2 Wednesday, February 25: Cairo, Egypt. We are met at the airport, assisted and escorted to our hotel for dinner.
- Day 3 Thursday, February 26: Cairo After breakfast, we travel to the Giza Plateau to visit the Great Pyramids and the Sphinx. These are some of the structures that the children of Israel built as slaves in Egypt. We then visit the famous Egyptian Museum where the treasures of King Tut Ein Khamon are exhibited. After an included lunch, we visit the amazing Cave Church carved in the side of the mountain. Here we'll enjoy singing in breathtaking surroundings. A delicious dinner is prepared for us at our hotel prior to a special opening event of fellowship and ministry.
- Day 4 Friday, February 27: Mt. Sinai We travel through the Sinai Desert to reach Mount Sinai, where God spoke to Moses from a burning bush (Exodus 3:10) and gave the tablets with the Ten Commandments to him. On the way, we cross the Suez Canal and stop at Elim and Mara the place where the people of Israel camped after fleeing from Egypt. We will celebrate the moment with Bible reading and singing. We arrive at Moses' Well (where Moses met his future wife, Zipporah). We lunch in Taba at a breathtaking sea side resort. Those wanting to climb Mt. Sinai will head towards our dessert motel. You must be fit to climb several hours on foot on stone steps. Camels will be able to take us partway up the mountain if desired. Others choosing not to participate in this adventure will check in this beautiful resort hotel overlooking the Red Sea for dinner and lodging.
- Day 5 Saturday, February 28: Mt. Sinai and Red Sea For the climbers: Around 1 AM, we begin our journey up Mount Sinai first with camels and then a 2–3 hour hike (750+ steps) on foot up the mountain to experience an unforgettable sunrise service in this spectacular setting. We descend for breakfast and continue our journey to the Red Sea where we meet the rest of the group at their breathtaking Red Sea Resort. Those not taking the hike will have the morning to enjoy the seashore and explore surrounding areas. After lunch together We cross the border to Israel and travel to our Dead Sea hotel for a good dinner.
- Day 6 Sunday, March 1: Qumran / Dead Sea / Masada We drive south to the Dead Sea through Qumran, to see the caves where the Dead Sea Scrolls were found. We'll then continue to Masada, the palace-fort built by King Herod. Here, in 73 A.D., 960 Jewish Zealots committed suicide rather than surrender to the Romans. The plateau is reached via a cable car ride with a spectacular view of the plains surrounding it. We'll also have the option to dip in the Dead Sea filled with rich minerals. We check in to our Jerusalem hotel where we will have dinner and celebration.
- Day 7 Monday, March 2: Jerusalem Bethlehem On the Mount of Olives, we study God's word before entering Jerusalem, as Melchizedek greeted Abraham (Genesis 14:18) and enjoy the panoramic view of the old and the new cities. We follow the path down the Palm Sunday Road to the Garden of Gethsemane (Matt 26:36) and the nearby Church of All Nations. We then take a short drive through the Kidron Valley to see Absalom and Zachariah's Tomb. We continue to Mount Zion (King David's tomb) and the Upper Room (John 13:1) site of the Last Supper. In the afternoon, we travel to the "little town of Bethlehem" (Matt 2:1ff) and the nearby Shepherd Fields. Here we will have an unforgettable outdoor service and enjoy a Bethlehem buffet lunch. Dinner and overnight in Jerusalem.
- Day 8 Tuesday, March 3: Jerusalem After breakfast, we visit the Wailing Wall (the Western Wall) the last remains of the temple built by King Herod. We then walk several stations of the Way of the Cross until we reach the modern city of Jerusalem and visit Yad Va Shem Museum (the Holocaust Museum). If time permits, we visit the Israel Museum where we can see a model of Jerusalem from Jesus' time and the original Dead Sea Scrolls. We travel to the Elah Valley, the site of the famous battle between David and Goliath. Our day ends with dinner at our hotel in Jerusalem.
- Day 9 Wednesday, March 4: After breakfast, we head to the City of David, where King David established his residence before taking the city. We walk through the Canaanite tunnel and visit the Pool of Siloam where Jesus sent the blind man to wash. (John 9:7) Nearby you'll see the tunnel built by King Hezekiah, to ensure water supply to the city. We visit the Garden Tomb at Golgotha. We dedicate time for a visit and communion near the tomb from where HE resurrected (John 19:40-41). Following the service, you'll enjoy free time to explore, shop or eat in the Old City. (Or reflect and rest at our hotel). Dinner and overnight in Jerusalem.

Day 10 – Thursday, March 5: Carmel / Caesarea /Jerusalem After breakfast, we drive to Mt. Carmel at the site where Elijah challenged the 450 false prophets of Baal (1 Kings 18). Here, we will have a special service while enjoying a spectacular view of the Valley of Armageddon (Rev 16:16). After our included lunch, we visit Caesarea (Acts 10:1), the port-city built by King Herod. Apostle Paul was imprisoned here until he was expelled to Rome. We reach our Sea of Galilee hotel for dinner and overnight.

Day 11 – Friday, March 6: Caesarea Philippi / Capernaum/ Tabgha / Korazim After breakfast, we drive to Caesarea Philippi, where Peter recognizes Jesus as the Son of God (Matt 16:18) and view the "Gates of Hell". We then take a boat ride on the Sea of Galilee (Matt 14:26-27). In the middle of the sea, we will all gather, stop the boats' engines, and have a truly unforgettable "Event at Sea". We'll enjoy "Peter's Fish Lunch" before reaching Capernaum to visit the ruins of an ancient synagogue where Jesus preached. This is also the site of Peter's House (Luke 4:31). Next is Tabgha, the site of the Multiplication of the Loaves and Fish (Matt 14:17) and then a visit to Korazim (Matt 11:21-22). At the end of the day, we visit the Jordan River with an opportunity to renew our baptismal vows in the Jordan, if desired. We return to Tiberias for dinner and overnight.

Day 12 – Saturday, March 7: Mt. Precipice / Nazareth / Megiddo/ Gideon's Spring/Magdala/ Mt Arbel After breakfast, we drive towards Magdala and see the 1st century Jewish synagogue. Proceed to Mt. Arbel with a stunning view of the Sea of Galilee where we will study the "Sermon on the Mount". This historical place served as a shelter to the Jews who revolted against the Romans. Next, we drive to Mt. Precipice where Jesus was rejected by the people of Nazareth (Luke 4:29-30) but "he passed through the midst of them and went away." From here we view the city of Nazareth. Next, we visit Nazareth Village, a hands-on village showing life in Jesus' time with houses, terraced fields, wine and olive presses, watch tower, synagogue, and more all built to resemble those that would have been in a Galilee village in the 1st century. Here we will enjoy an authentic 1st century lunch. Continue to Megiddo, the multi-layered Biblical city overlooking the Valley of Armageddon (Rev 16:16). If time permits, we will visit Gideon's Spring where he selected his army. A special gathering is planned before returning to our hotel for dinner.

Day 13 – Sunday, March 8: Mt. Nebo / The Promised Land After breakfast we visit Mt. Nebo, the traditional burial place of Moses. From here he saw the promised land but could not have entered. After an amazing lunch at a restaurant in Mt. Nebo we'll take our last look into Israel where reflect on visiting the "Promised Land" and look forward to one day arriving home in the "Promised Land". After a short city tour of Amman we reach our hotel. Dinner and overnight in the capital of Jordan - Amman.

Day 14 – Monday, March 9: After breakfast, we travel to explore the Nabatean city of Petra. This is one of the most striking sites upon earth, declared as a world wonder. After a short walk in a beautiful canyon, we come upon an old temple carved into the sandstone of the canyon, beyond which, lies the city of Petra. It was built in the 4thcentury as a shelter city for caravans that crossed the desert between Egypt and Syria. We return for dinner and our final night Amman.

Day 15 – Tuesday, March 10: Flight back home. Arrival on same day.

Vision & Additional Teachings: In addition to the teachings and special events planned during our journey, we will also have pre-trip online sessions with our speakers who will deliver powerful teachings as we prepare our hearts for this trip of a lifetime (as well has helpful tips & your FAQs). Printed custom program and study guide will be provided to help you make the most of this experience.

<u>Passports and Visas:</u> Your passport must be valid at least until September 10, 2026. It is your responsibility to check that your passport is valid for travel. As per TSA Guidelines passports must be valid at least 6 months after the return date. USA citizens must have a ETA to Israel, apply at: https://israel-entry.piba.gov.il. Other nationalities please check www.israelemb.org. We arrange group visas to Egypt and Jordan (cost included at current rates. Subject to change). Luggage: 1 piece of 50lb is allowed per person + 1 carry on (should not exceed 14lbs).

RESERVATIONS & PAYMENT: A \$1,250 USD deposit per person (by check, money order or bank transfer) is required at time of registration. Bank Transfer must add \$25 US. Credit cards are accepted as payment but are subject to an additional 4% processing fee. Initial deposits need to be submitted as soon as possible to guarantee your space. Final payment no later than Sept 13, 2025 to avoid a \$100 late payment fee. Non-full payment by Oct 14, 2025 will cause an automatic seat cancellation with the airline.
